Definition Domestic Material Consumption (DMC) monitors the total amount of materials, which are directly used within the national economy. The indicator is calculated as Direct Material Input (Domestic Extraction plus Imports) minus Exports.

Method of calculation $DMC = \text{Domestic Extraction} + \text{Imports} - \text{Exports}$
