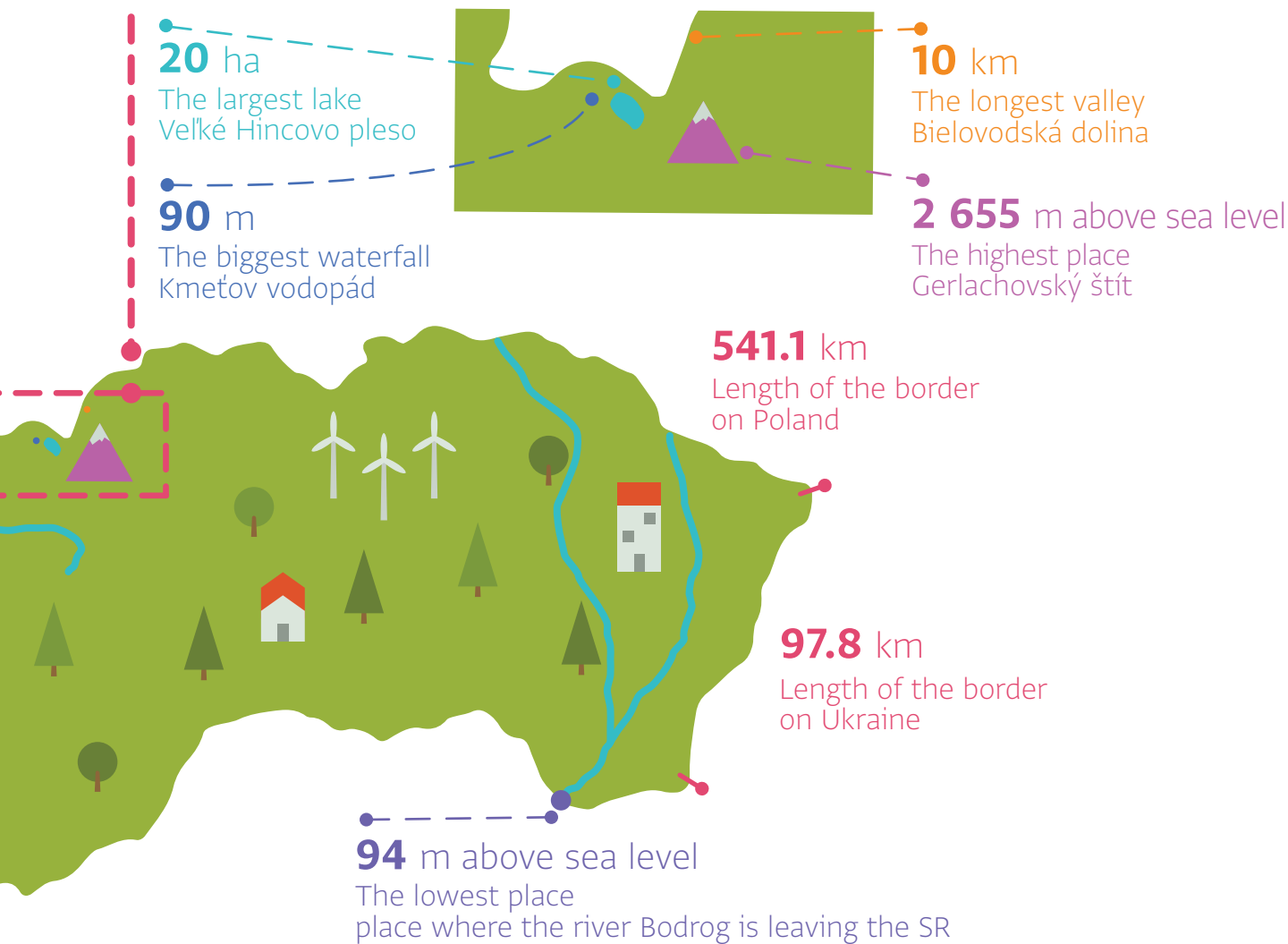

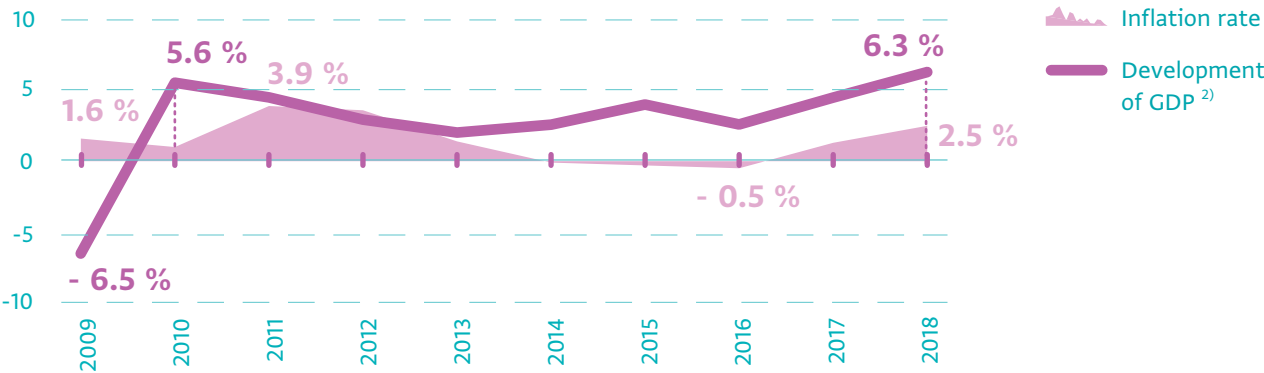

Development of GDP at curr. p. and inflation (year-on-year change in %)

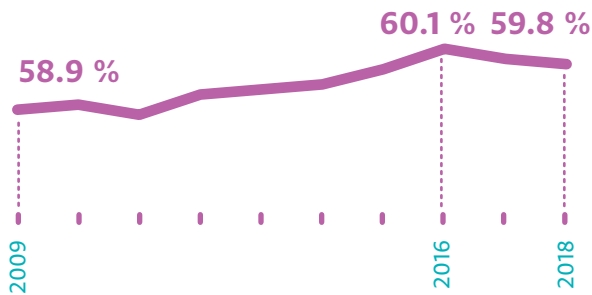

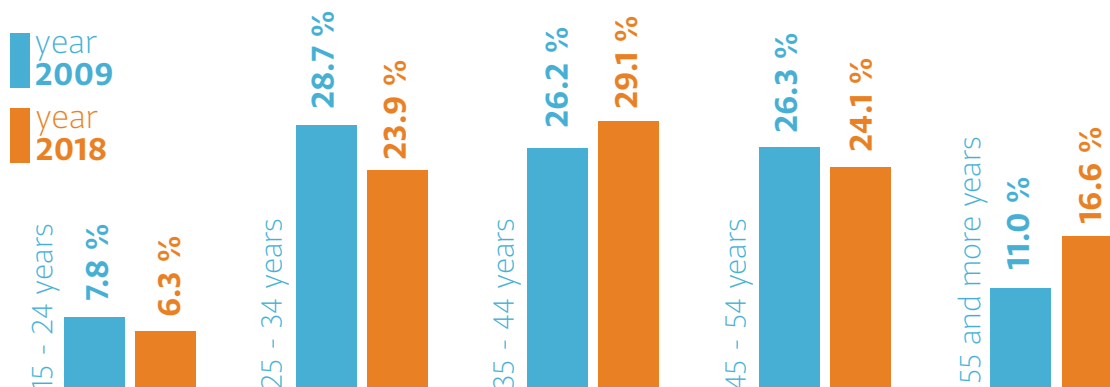


Development of employment rate

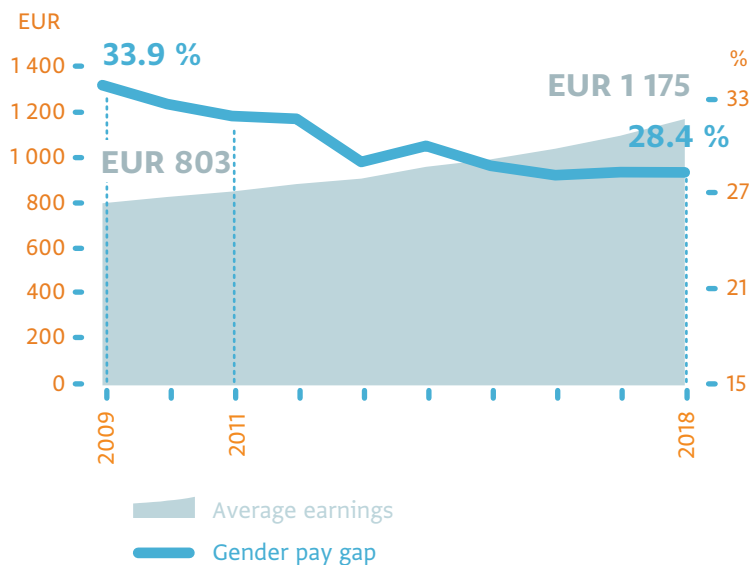

Development of average gross monthly earnings of employee

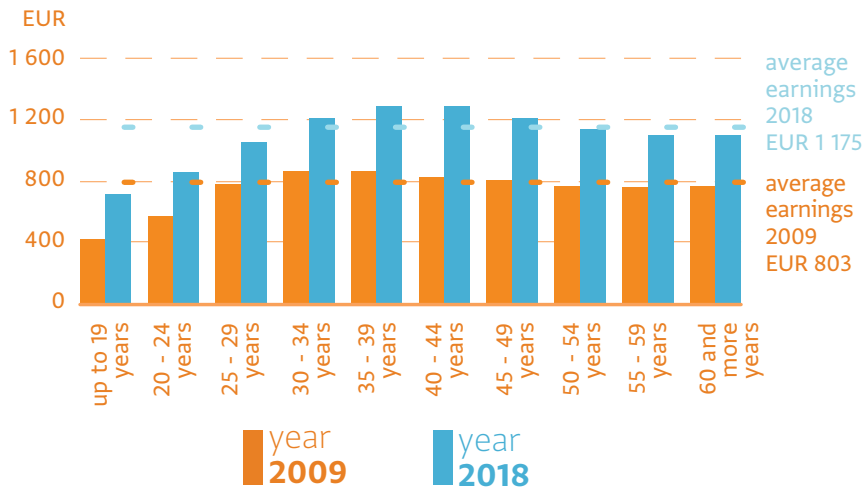

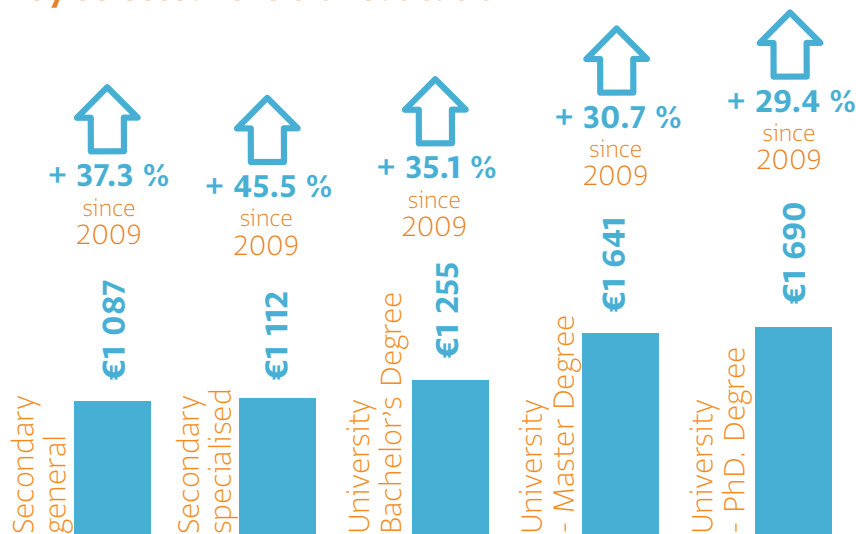

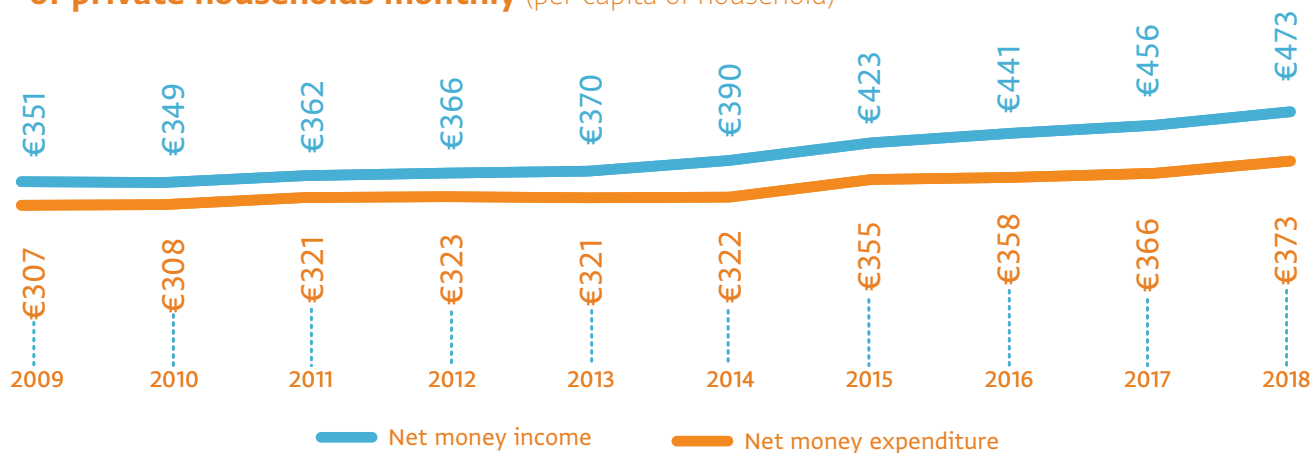

Development of net money income and expenditure of private households monthly (per capita of household)



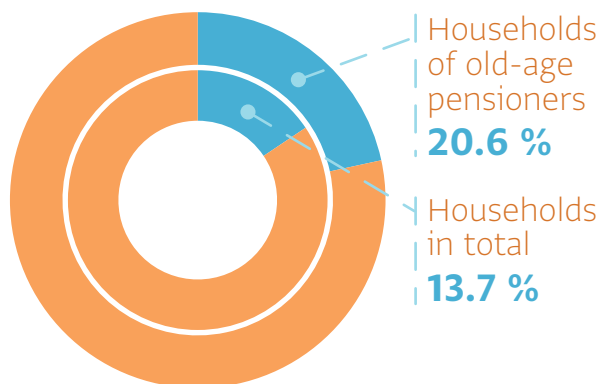

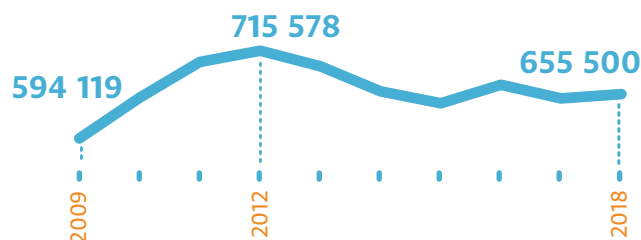

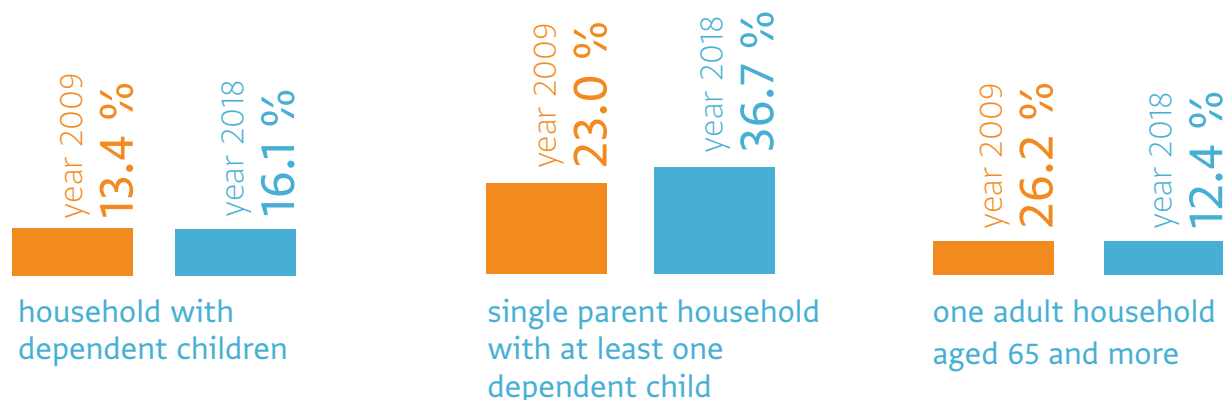


Development of the number of persons below the at-risk-of-poverty threshold (60 % median)

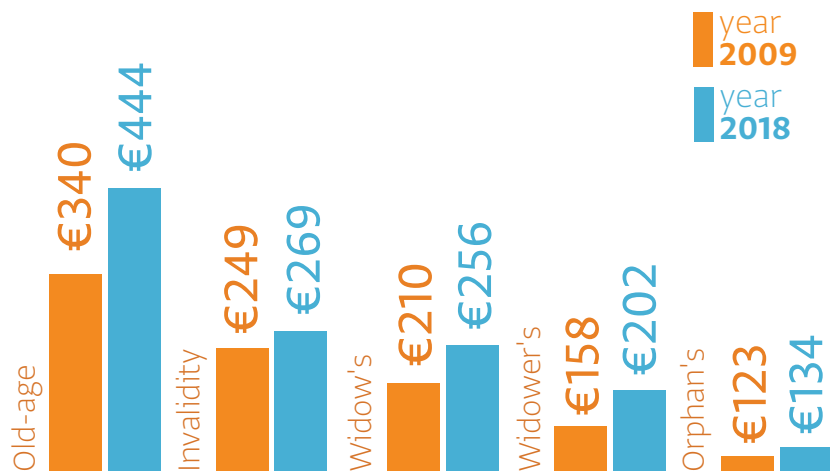

Structure of pensions paid ¹⁾

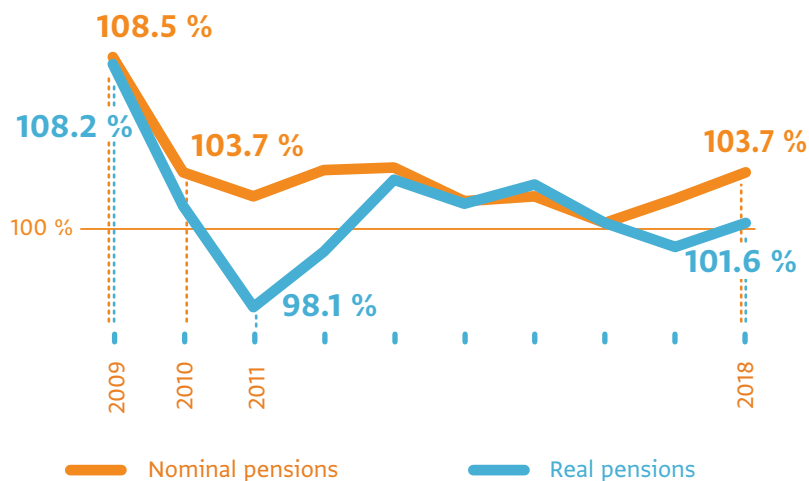

Development of gross domestic product (EUR billion)

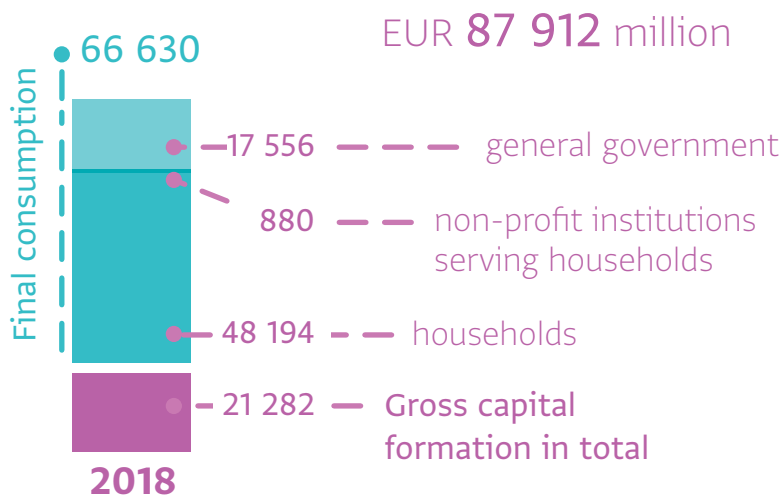

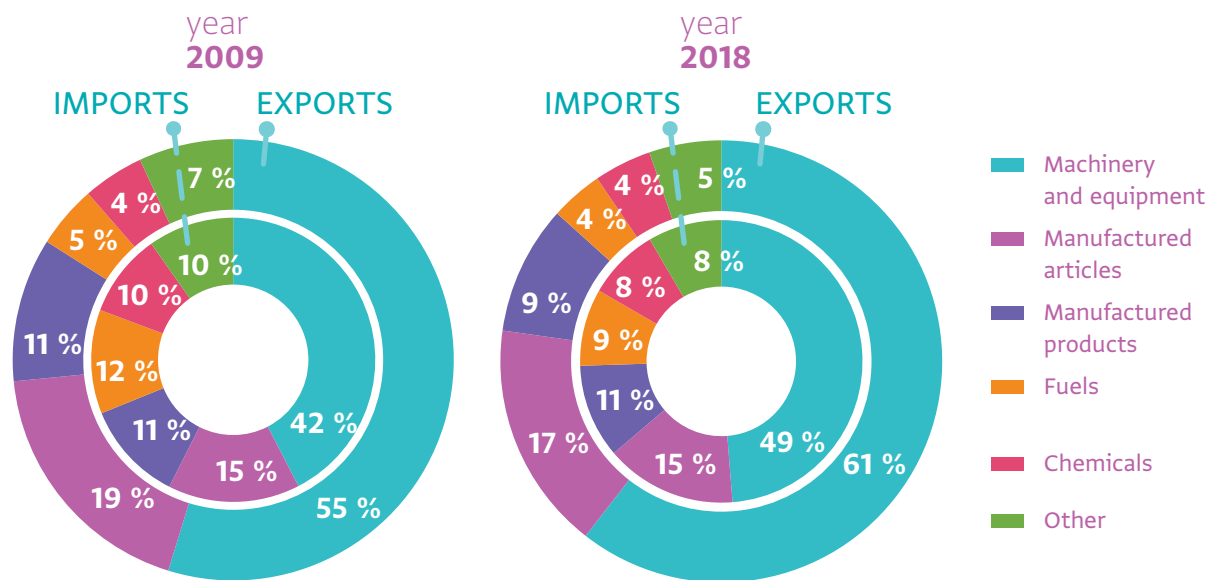


Proportion of selected countries on total imports

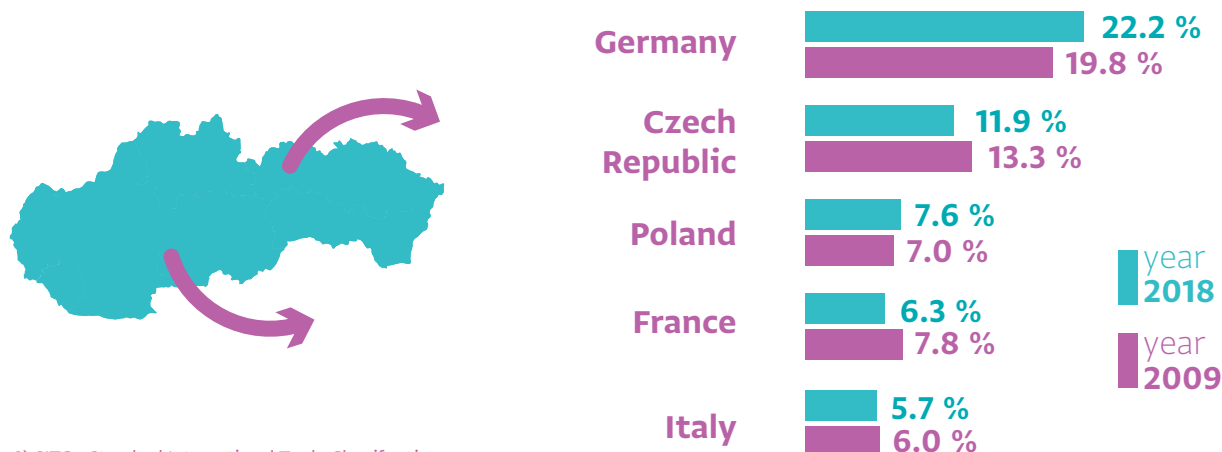

Structure of imports and exports by sections of nomenclature SITC ³⁾



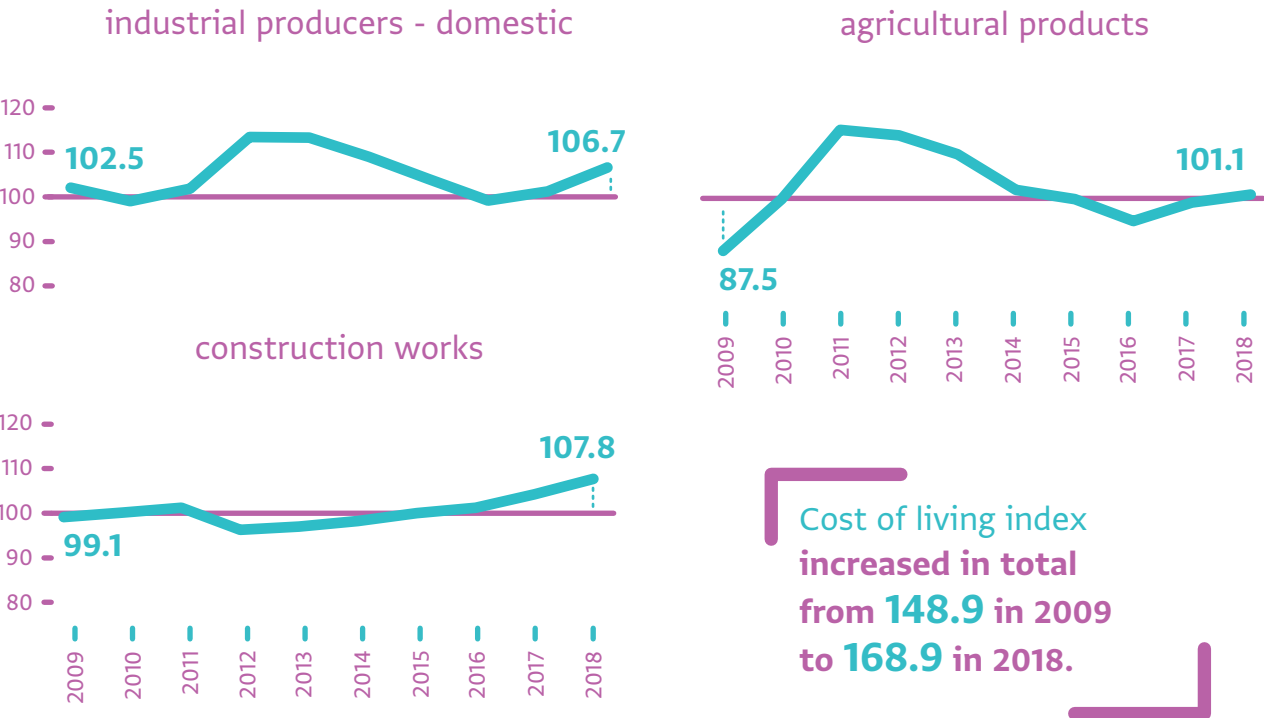

Enterprises by registered number of employees

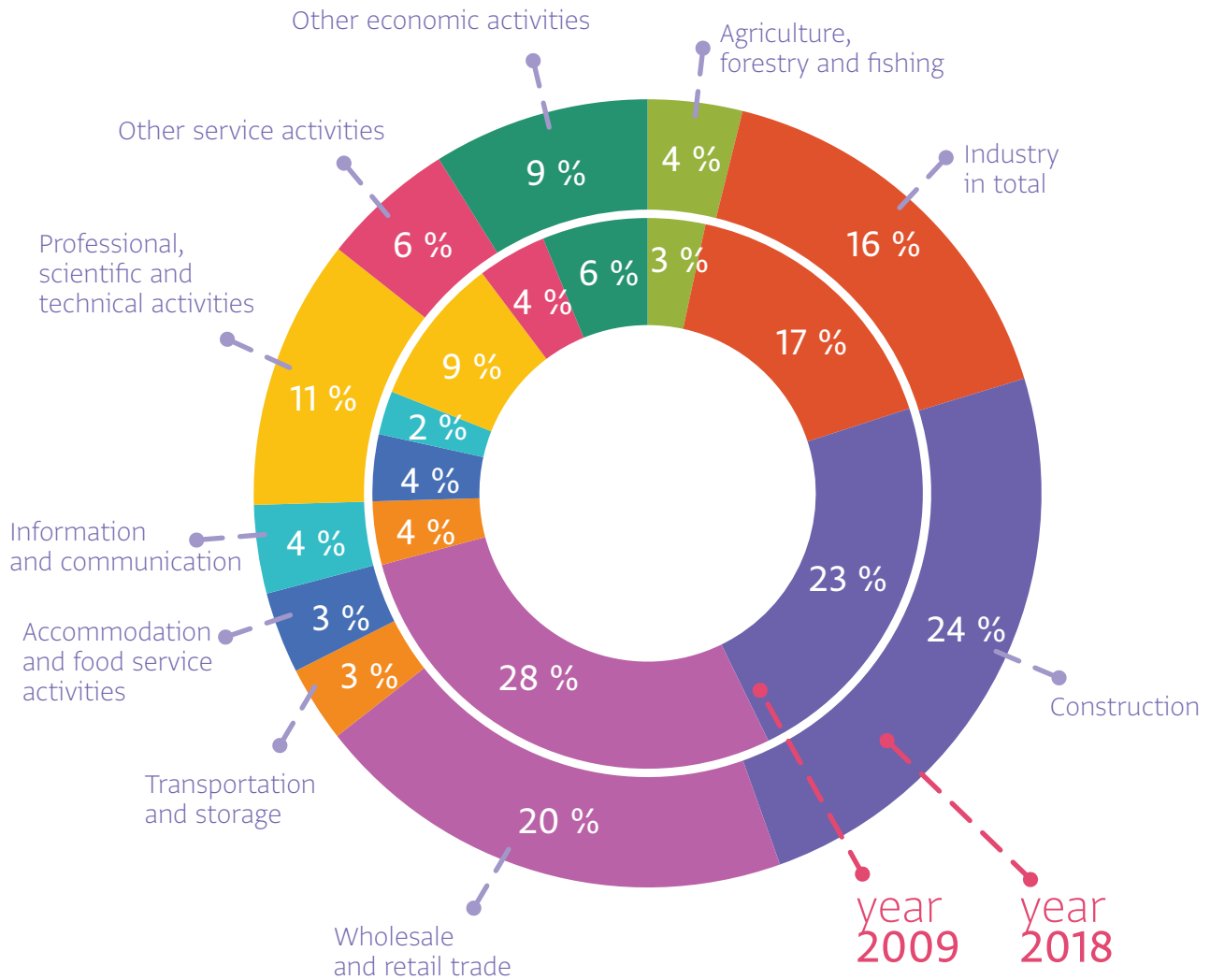

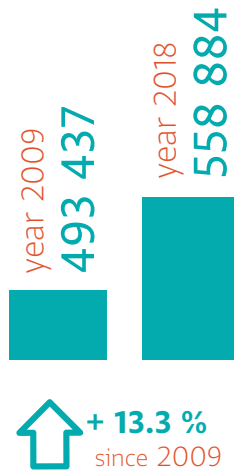

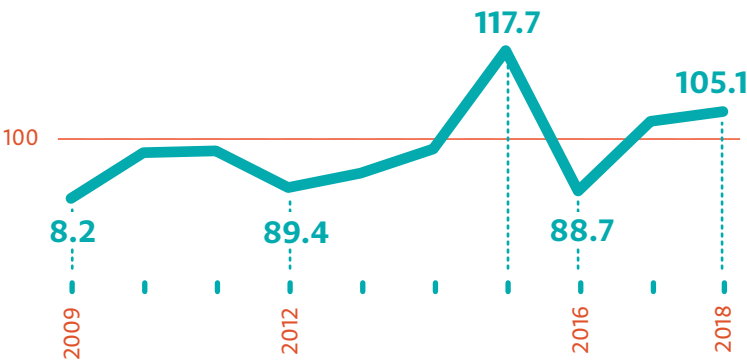
Year-on-year change of the volume of industrial production, 2018

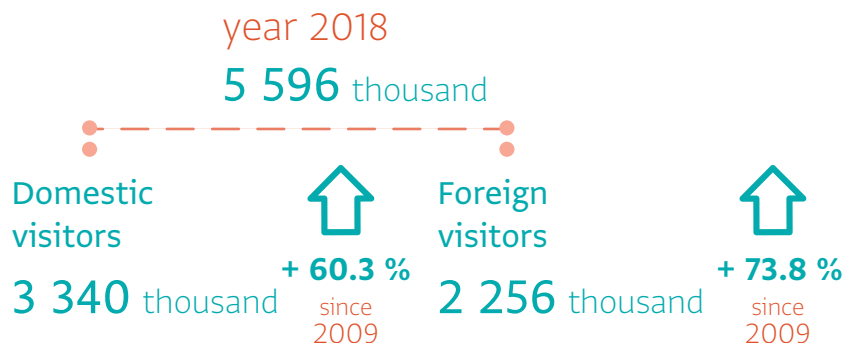
Development of the number of accommodation establishments as of Dec. 31

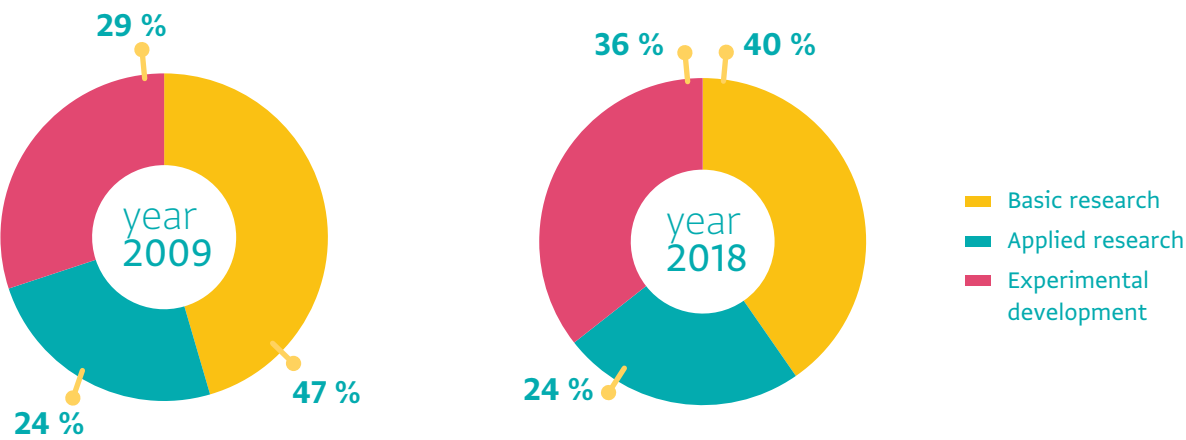

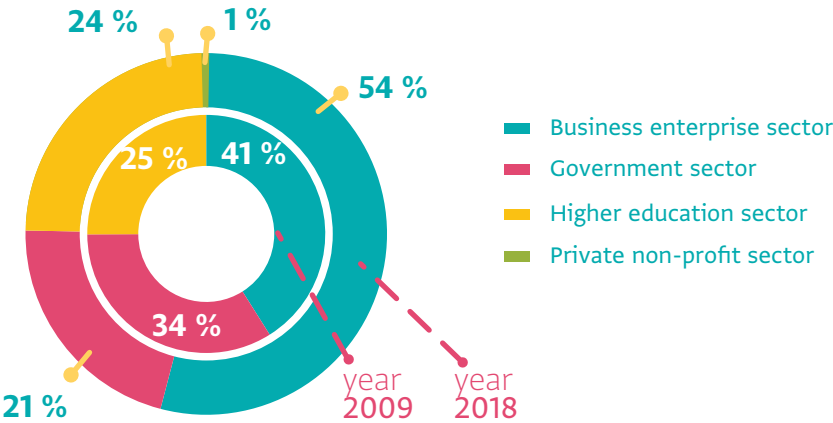
